1. What is the message of your book? What do you feel is the promise that it makes?

4. Are there specific exercises a person can do to ground this material more thoroughly in their own life?
5. What do you see happening for humanity in the coming years, especially with regards to technology, and why?
6. Can you elaborate on the role of the masculine and feminine? How is that relationship changing over time? Is there a way I can respond?
7. Some may feel that the book is a repudiation of God and religion in the traditional sense of those words. How would you respond to that perspective? And how does this material fit in with the religious beliefs of Christianity, Buddhism, Wicca, Hindus, New Age, and so on?
8. Can you talk more about self-love? It feels like a nebulous concept. How can I make it real in my own life?
9. You seem to be offering a more inclusive definition of life than what modern science proposes life to be. How are you choosing to define the word, and why the change?
10. Compassion, forgiveness, and acceptance seem to be very important aspects of this book. What are we to forgive ourselves for, what are we to accept, and why are we so encouraged to feel compassion?

11. There is a lot of spiritual material out there, ranging from *A Course In Miracles* to *Conversations With God*. What need does this book fill compared with all the others?
12. I understand that you had a life-changing spiritual experience. Can you tell us a bit about that?
13. Can you tell us a bit about your personal spiritual views?
14. Are you working on anything new, and if so—what is it?
