Lost Civilization Enigma

- 1. Last year, you wrote "The Ancient Alien Question", in which you addressed the question that we are not alone. Now, in "The Lost Civilization Enigma", what conclusions do you reach about lost civilizations?
- 2. You state that science has been confronted with evidence of lost civilizations, but consistently has made sure this evidence is disputed or thrown away. Can you expand?
- 3. In the case of the Bosnian Pyramids, you've seen the controversy since it began in 2005 and also the extent to which scientists will go to claim there is nothing to it. But this is definitely not the first case, as you point out with the Glozel controversy, in which innocent men were even put in jail so scientists could maintain their denial.
- 4. There is a lot of speculation about Atlantis. What and where is Atlantis and what is the best evidence for its existence?
- 5. Heinrich Schliemann's discovery of Troy showed that legends and myths are real so why, more than a century onwards from this discovery, is science still so reluctant to accept they contain or are real, not fantasy?
- 6. Apart from lost civilizations, there are also lost aspects of known civilizations or newly discovered aspects of known civilizations. You've shown how pyramids are a vital aspect of both ancient Peru and ancient Bosnia. What is so important or interesting about pyramids and why can they be so controversial?
- 7. Are all legendary civilizations, like Lemuria or Mu, and other reputed civilizations in the Amazon and Tibet true?
- 8. You also show evidence for advanced technology and knowledge present in known and forgotten civilizations. How advanced were these civilizations?
- 9. You conclude that civilization is far older than science is currently willing to give credit for. What can you reveal about who our ancestors really were?
- 10. What is in your opinion the earliest sign of civilization?
